# Introduction

**UPPER ARLINGTON CITY SCHOOLS** is a public school district committed to serving the students, families and residents of the Upper Arlington community by providing a world-class educational experience in an efficient and financially responsible manner.

Academic achievement and extra-curricular excellence have long been hallmarks of the Upper Arlington school system. While student performance ranks the district among the best, financial practices have earned the district similar accolades, including the coveted AAA bond rating from Standard and Poor's. Reaching these high standards has been possible due to a combination of the caliber of Upper Arlington students, the dedication of their families, the talent level of the staff and a tremendous amount of support from the community.

A transparent partnership between the schools and the community is of paramount importance to the success of both entities. In November of 2012, voters turned down a 5.8-mill levy request that was designed to last 3 years. Upper Arlington Schools recognized the community's desire for change and implemented cost-reduction measures and reduced future budget projections. Those actions, combined with an increase in revenue due to utility and casino taxes and a reduction in medical insurance premiums, will improve the district's financial outlook by approximately \$21 million by the end of fiscal year 2017.

In November of 2013, voters will see a much lower levy request that is designed to last longer. The four-year, 4-mill request is possible due, in part, to the recent cost-reduction measures and the district's commitment to engage in this Efficiency Project, which will utilize creativity, technology, partnerships and shared services to reduce forecasted costs by a cumulative amount of \$4.5 million by the end of fiscal year 2017. The district will also strive to identify additional revenue streams outside of new levies. Combined, all of these measures will enable the district to continue to exercise financial discipline and maintain appropriate reserves.\*

While the term efficiency leads many to think of financial matters, Upper Arlington Schools' Efficiency Project is designed to benefit more than the bottom line. As an educational institution, the district believes that all actions must help support the creation of positive and successful learning environments for students. This project will do just that - by eliminating overlap and streamlining practices while increasing the focus on student and instructional needs. Enabling concentration on the most important elements of the educational experience will allow the district to continue in its role as a leader among high-achieving and innovative school districts.

# Process

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**THE FIRST**, and perhaps most important, step in the Efficiency Project is gathering input from the many groups that play a role in the success of Upper Arlington Schools and, in turn, the students of this community. To that end the district will invite members of the Financial Advisory and Consulting Team (FACT) and the PTO Presidents Council to serve as advisory groups throughout the project. With the help of these engaged parents and residents, the district will create an easily accessible online survey to gather feedback from the entire community. The survey will include multiple-choice questions and opportunities to provide open-ended responses. A link to the survey will be available on the district website, social media presences and pushed out through parent emails. Paper copies of the survey will be made available at schools, the Upper Arlington Senior Center, Upper Arlington Library locations and city offices.

The district will also conduct an internal needs assessment by holding staff-member forums at each of the district's facilities. These meetings will focus on defining the primary needs for providing a world-class educational experience for Upper Arlington students.

The next step in the process will be analyzing and interpreting the data provided by the survey. District leaders will share these results publicly and work with the advisory groups to collect additional feedback, including potential action steps for moving forward.

Finally, the district leadership team will synthesize all of the available data and create a detailed plan of action. This plan will include the targeted cost-reduction amounts for each of the next three fiscal years. It will also include the areas in which these efficiencies will be sought and a summary of the action steps necessary to make these changes a reality.

Advisory team members and district leaders will report back to the board upon the completion of the initial plan and in conjunction with the treasurer's five-year forecast presentations that occur in May and October of each year.
