


JONES MIDDLE SCHOOL BUILDING TEAM SURVEY FEEDBACK MAY 2016

District leaders asked the members of each school's building team to take a brief online survey in which they selected their preferred option for that school building. Twenty-six members of the Jones Middle School building team responded. All results and comments are included in the compiled totals and feedback.

JONES MIDDLE SCHOOL COMMENTS

- Neither option works for me. There has to be a middle option.
- The new gym is badly needed!
- Gym space is essential.
- A priority must be separate gym & auditorium facilities!!
- If you are going to move the Tennis courts to the current location of Central Office why would you not put 5 tennis courts in when a middle school match consists of 5 matches? If you changes the orientation of the courts it looks like there would be enough room. Additionally, the repair option honestly seems like a waste of money in the long term. Our building is old and needs to catch up to other area middle schools. The gymnasium need is far too great to be stuck with the repair option.
- This option gives the longest life-cycle to the building. Jones, as a historic building itself is the least likely to be 'torn down and redone' like the high school should be... so over the longer term, this will be the cheaper option for UA

- While the additional space and updates would be positive, I think the needs for the district are greater in other buildings. The acquisition of private and public lands to provide the tennis courts would be added expense. With the unknown cost related to the district office relocation, the question is too open-ended regarding the needed space within UA proper. Because the additional land does not "solve" the problem of the tennis teams having to compete with only 4 courts, I think the current courts should remain.
- In a perfect world, I would prefer the renovate option but I am torn - I'm a teacher in the district as well as a resident. On one hand, I know what the renovate option will provide and how much it is needed for our school and community. On the other hand, I know what is happening in our building. As a resident, I will be asked to help pay for these district wide costs but right now, I don't see Jones preparing our students for the future much less, for their High School experience,
- Too expensive. Find a way to cut \$10M off the \$48M price tag and make it work.
- Please use materials that will blend with current Jones building.
- Renovation is not needed near term (5 yrs) but it is the best long term plan for JMS.
