


# FACILITIES TASK FORCE SURVEY FEEDBACK

MAY 2016




### BURBANK EARLY CHILDHOOD SCHOOL COMMENTS

- Pre-school - what is the cost and where does that money go? Do we need Burbank if other schools are renovated/rebuilt?
- As Burbank is the newest building in the district, it seems reasonable not to rebuild the entire school. Renovate+ is a good middle ground between Repair+ and Rebuild.
- Although I support the mission and current use of the school, this facility has the least amount of impact on the traditional UA education program (k-12). Agree that the facility may need some repair and upgrades. I rather spend the funding on the other k-12 schools.




### BARRINGTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL COMMENTS





### GREENSVIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL COMMENTS




### TREMONT ELEMENTARY SCHOOL COMMENTS




### WICKLIFFE PROGRESSIVE SCHOOL COMMENTS




### WINDERMERE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL COMMENTS







### JONES MIDDLE SCHOOL COMMENTS
