#### **Attention Parents of 6th graders:**

Immunization Requirements for Next Year's Incoming 7th Grade for 2019-20 School Year

The following immunizations are required prior to your child entering the 7th grade:

- Tdap vaccine (this is the booster shot to the DTaP series)
- Meningococcal vaccine.

Currently, many students in the 6th grade do not have a recorded date for either of these immunizations. Gathering this information can be very time consuming, so I am asking for your help. If I do not have current dates for these immunizations, I will be reaching out to you over the spring break via the "Blackboard" email communication. As soon as I receive this information, I will remove your name from the email list. After your child has received the vaccine, please provide me with: Month / Date / Year of the vaccination

- I do not necessarily need any paperwork from the doctor. You can email or phone me with the date or include it when registering your child for the new school year.
- If your child will see their doctor over the summer or in the early fall and will receive his/her vaccination at that visit, you can inform me of the future date and this is acceptable.

#### The Flu

The single best way to protect against seasonal flu and its potential severe complications is for children to get a seasonal influenza vaccine each year. Flu vaccination is recommended for all children aged 6 months and older. Making healthy choices at school and at home can help prevent the flu and spreading flu to others. I encourage children, parents, and staff to take the following everyday preventive actions:

Stay home when you are sick. If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. You will help prevent others from catching your illness. Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. Germs spread this way.

Clean and disinfect surfaces or objects. Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work or school, especially when someone is ill. https://www.cdc.gov/flu/school/index.htm

If your child is diagnosed with a contagious illness such as influenza (the flu), strep, or whooping cough, please notify the School Nurse at jmead@uaschools.org
